Key Stages in an IPO:

Pending: Issuer has filed with Regulatory Body.

Complete: Issuer has filed with Regulatory Body and Effective Date established.

Post-IPO Transaction: This stage begins on the day that the company's share begin trading on a Stock Exchange.

Postponed: Issuer has postponed the Offer.

Withdrawn: Issuer has withdrawn the Offer.

What to consider when buying IPO data

We identify associated securities where an IPO security is issued alongside additional securities beyond just the IPO itself. This highlights potential dilution and ensures that investors understand they are purchasing a portion of the total outstanding securities

The **Lock-up Period** indicates when these additional shares may not be immediately tradeable rather at a near future date which again may result in more shares being listed and therefore driving down the market price.
